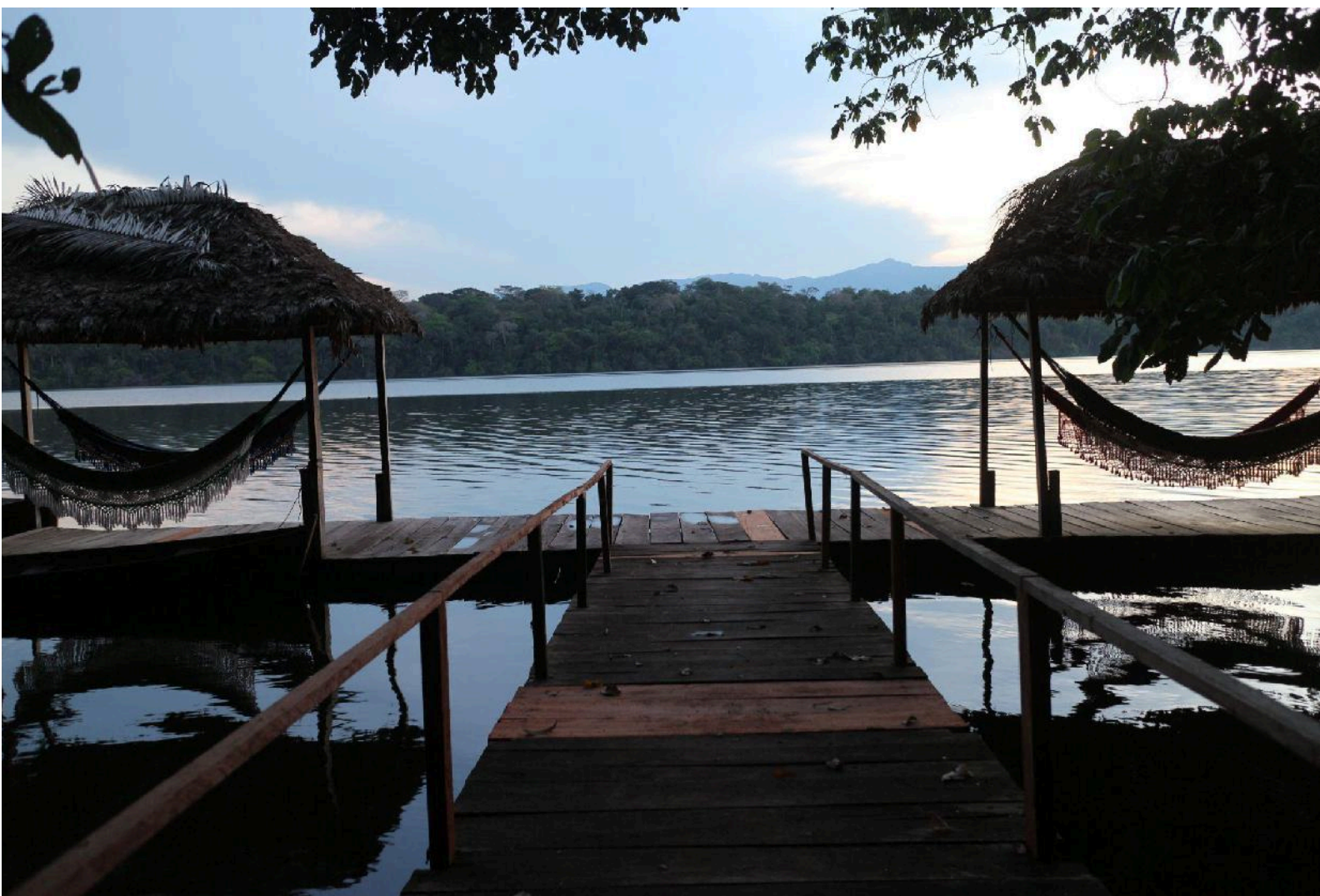




# 4D/3N YURUMA (MADIDI NATIONAL PARK) & PAMPAS DEL YACUMA



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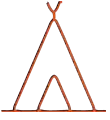
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## Day 1. Rurrenabaque – Yuruma (Madidi National Park)



Night in tree tent / Cabin

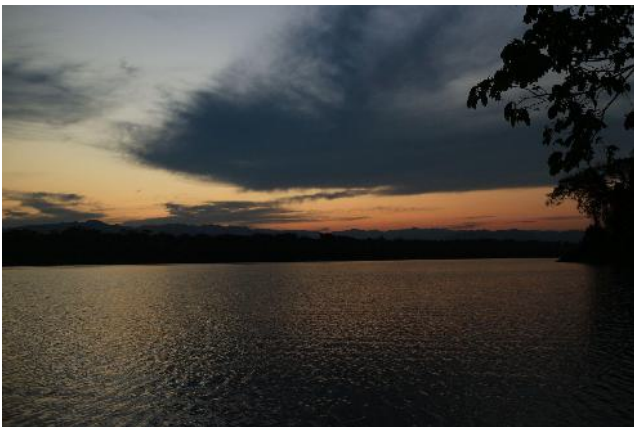

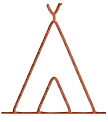

- At the scheduled time, pickup from the airport / hotel / bus station and transfer to the port of Rurrenabaque. We begin the adventure navigating the Beni and Tuichi Rivers, where the last Andean foothills merge with the Amazon. During the journey, we pass through the impressive Bala Canyon before entering Madidi National Park.
- After 4–5 hours of navigation, we take a gentle walk along the Wabu Trail (30 minutes) and arrive at Yuruma Refuge, located on the shores of the wonderful Santa Rosa Lake.
- Accommodation is provided either in hanging tents — a unique experience that allows you to sleep suspended among the trees — or in an eco-cabin. \*Depending on the departure time from Rurrenabaque, lunch will be served either en route or at Yuruma Refuge after arrival.
- In the afternoon, there is a guided walk along the Lucachi Trail, visiting macaw nesting areas and observing wildlife endemic to Madidi.
- Dinner and a nighttime walk to discover the life that awakens in the jungle after dark.

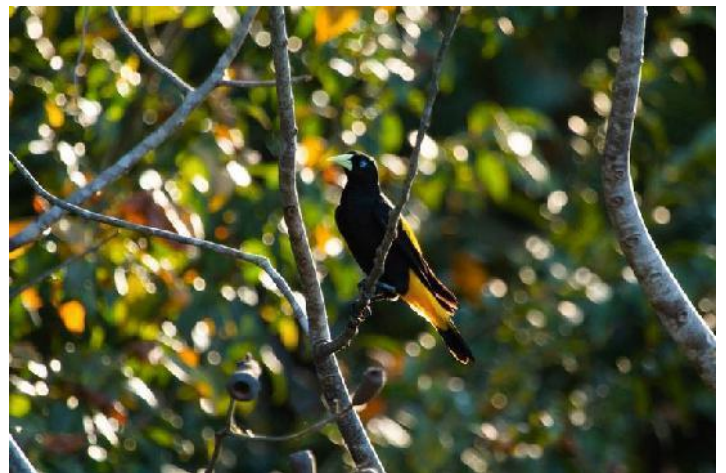

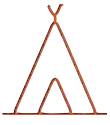

- The day begins with the sounds of the jungle. Breakfast.
- A 3-hour hike along the Tejón Trail, crossing primary forest more than 300 years old, learning about ancient trees, medicinal plants, and the wildlife that inhabits this ecosystem.
- After lunch, time to relax by the lake.
- In the afternoon, activities at Santa Rosa Lake: canoeing, swimming, and traditional piranha fishing, surrounded by a serene and almost untouched landscape.
- At night, dinner and a cultural talk, where local guides share Amazonian stories, knowledge, and legends.



## Day 3. Yuruma – Rurrenabaque – Pampas del Yacuma

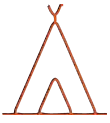

- Departure very early in the morning to enjoy the sunrise on the Tuichi River, one of the most memorable moments of the trip, accompanied by the songs of birds and howler monkeys.
- Return to Rurrenabaque by boat, approximately 3 hours. \*Depending on the departure time, breakfast will be served either at the camp before leaving or en route.
- Ground transfer to the Yacuma Pampas in a comfortable air-conditioned vehicle for about 1.5 hours. This journey offers opportunities to observe birds, toucans, capybaras, and sloths.
- Arrival at the port of Santa Rosa de Yacuma. Lunch.
- After lunch, we navigate the Yacuma River for approximately 2 hours, with a high probability of spotting caimans, capybaras, turtles, and a wide variety of birds.
- Arrival at the refuge, welcome refreshment, and accommodation in the rooms.
- Dinner and a nighttime walk in the Pampas forests to discover nocturnal birds and other animals that inhabit the area.



## Day 4. Pampas del Yacuma - Rurrenabaque

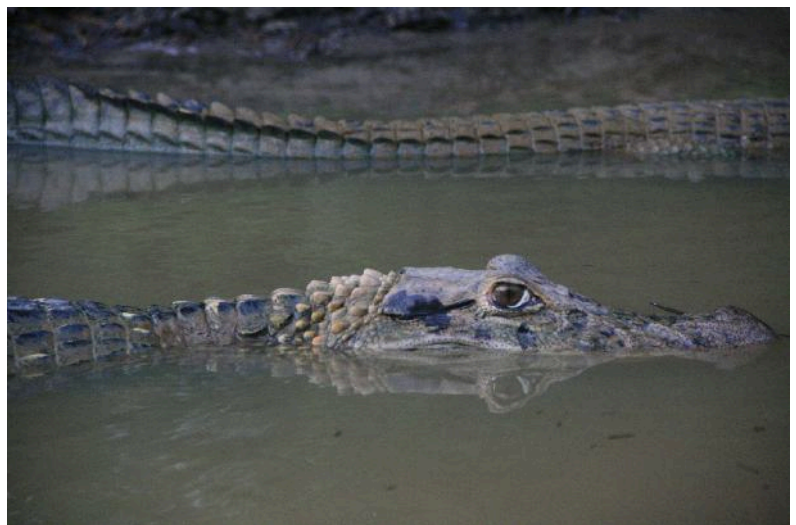
- We will wake up early to watch the sunrise and listen to the sounds of howler monkeys (*Alouatta sara*) and different species of birds announcing the start of the day. Breakfast will be served.

Afterward, we take a walk through forests and lagoons, exploring the habitat of the anaconda. With a bit of luck, we may be able to spot one! During the excursion, we will observe a variety of birds, caimans, turtles, and other wildlife.

Lunch, followed by a boat ride back to the port and return by car to Rurrenabaque.

Transfer to the airport / hotel / bus station.
